Year 12 completers and early school leavers living in the Rest of NSW

2021 NSW Post-School Destinations and Experiences Survey

This fact sheet provides an overview of findings from the 2021 NSW Post-School Destinations and Experiences Survey. Results are presented for Year 12 completers and early school leavers who live in areas outside of Greater Sydney (the Rest of NSW).

Survey sample

There were 42,388 recent school leavers who completed the survey in 2021. Of these:

- 10,240 Year 12 completers and 3,349 early school leavers were living in the Rest of NSW.
- 25,676 Year 12 completers and 3,123 early school leavers were living in Greater Sydney.

Post-school destinations of school leavers living in the Rest of NSW in 2021

Of the recent school leavers living in the Rest of NSW in 2021, 91.7% of Year 12 completers and 83.4% of early school leavers were in education, training or employment.

Year 12 completers

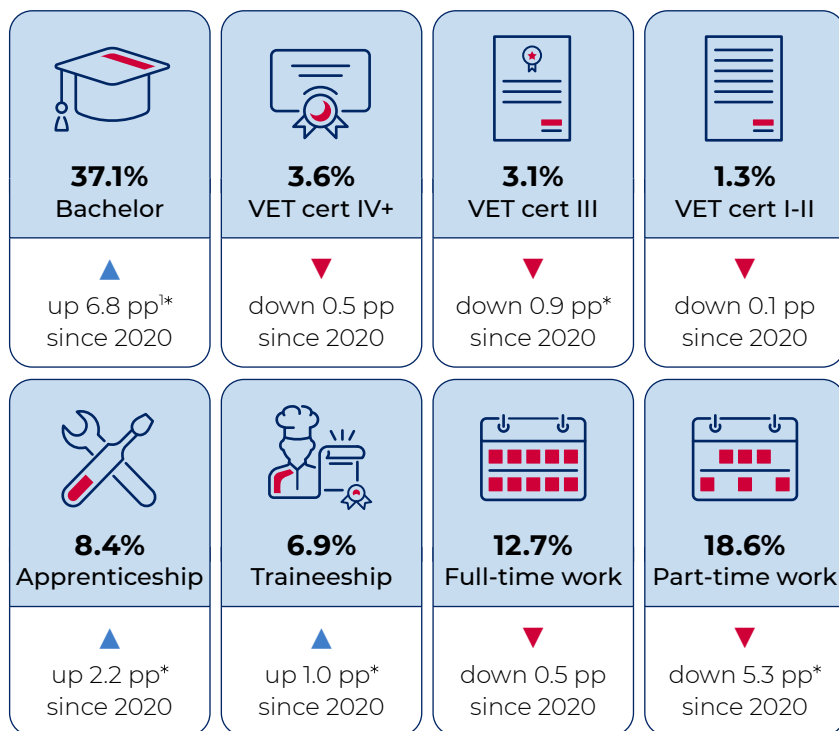


Early school leavers

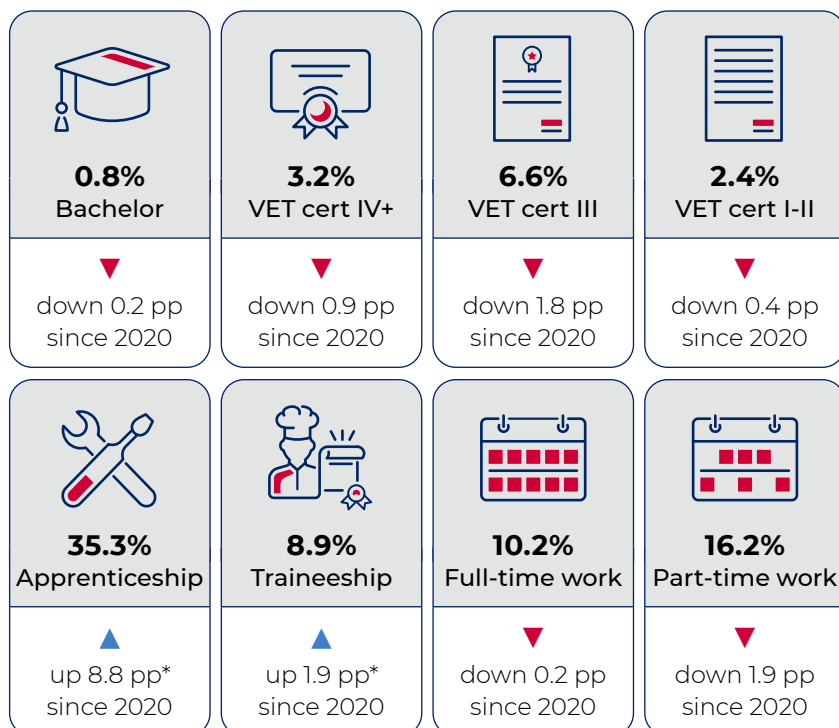
Post-school destinations of Year 12 completers living in the Rest of NSW in 2021



Compared to 2020, the proportion of Year 12 completers living in the Rest of NSW undertaking a VET cert III or engaged in part-time work has decreased, while the proportion undertaking a bachelor degree, apprenticeship or traineeship has increased.

Compared to 2014, the proportion of Year 12 completers living in the Rest of NSW undertaking a cert IV+ in 2021 has decreased, while the proportion engaged in full-time work has increased.

Post-school destinations of early school leavers living in the Rest of NSW in 2021



The proportion of early school leavers living in the Rest of NSW who were undertaking an apprenticeship or traineeship has increased since 2020.

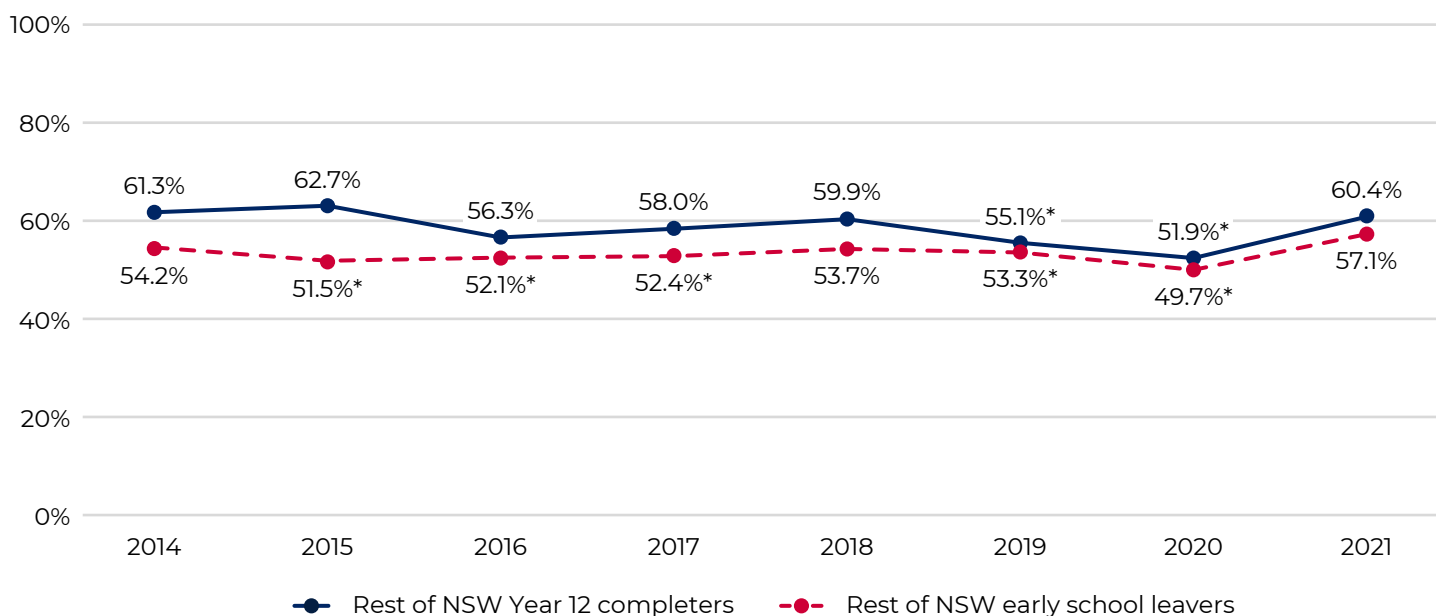
Compared to 2014, the proportion of early school leavers living in the Rest of NSW who were undertaking a VET cert IV+ or a VET cert I-II has decreased, while the proportion of early school leavers living in the Rest of NSW who were undertaking an apprenticeship or engaged in part-time work has increased.

Note. Percentage point differences accompanied by an asterisk (*) are statistically significant at a 99% confidence level ($p < .01$). Statistical significance is determined by both the size of the groups being compared and the percentage point difference between them.

In education or training

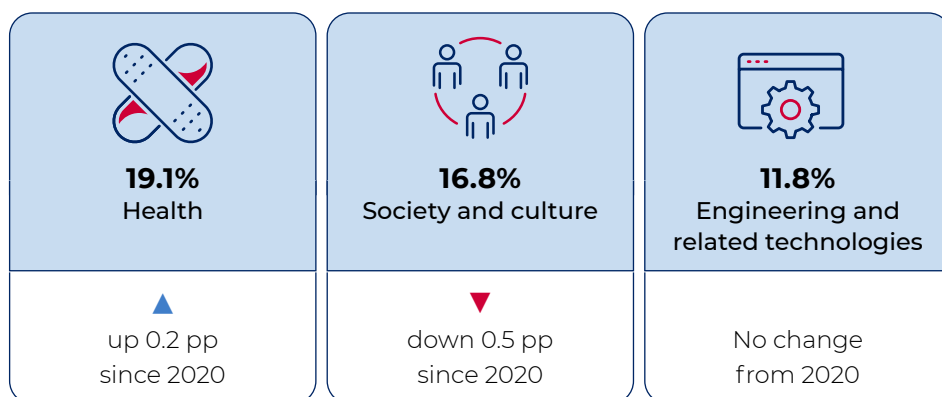
In the Rest of NSW, the proportion of Year 12 completers and early school leavers in education or training increased between 2020 and 2021.

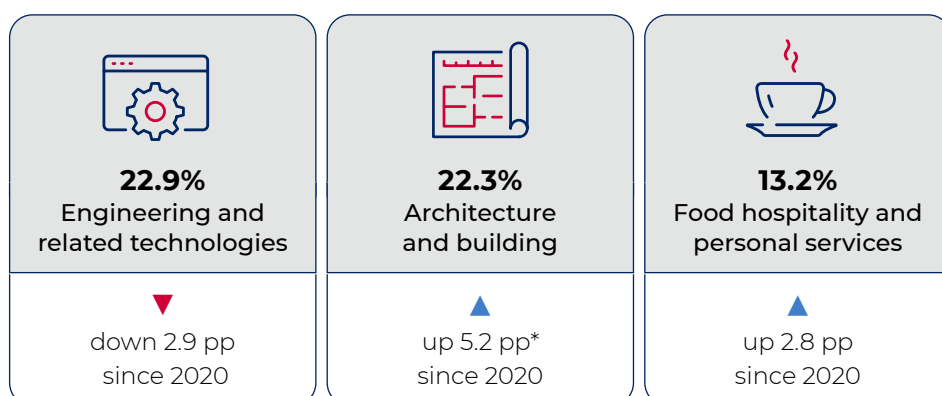

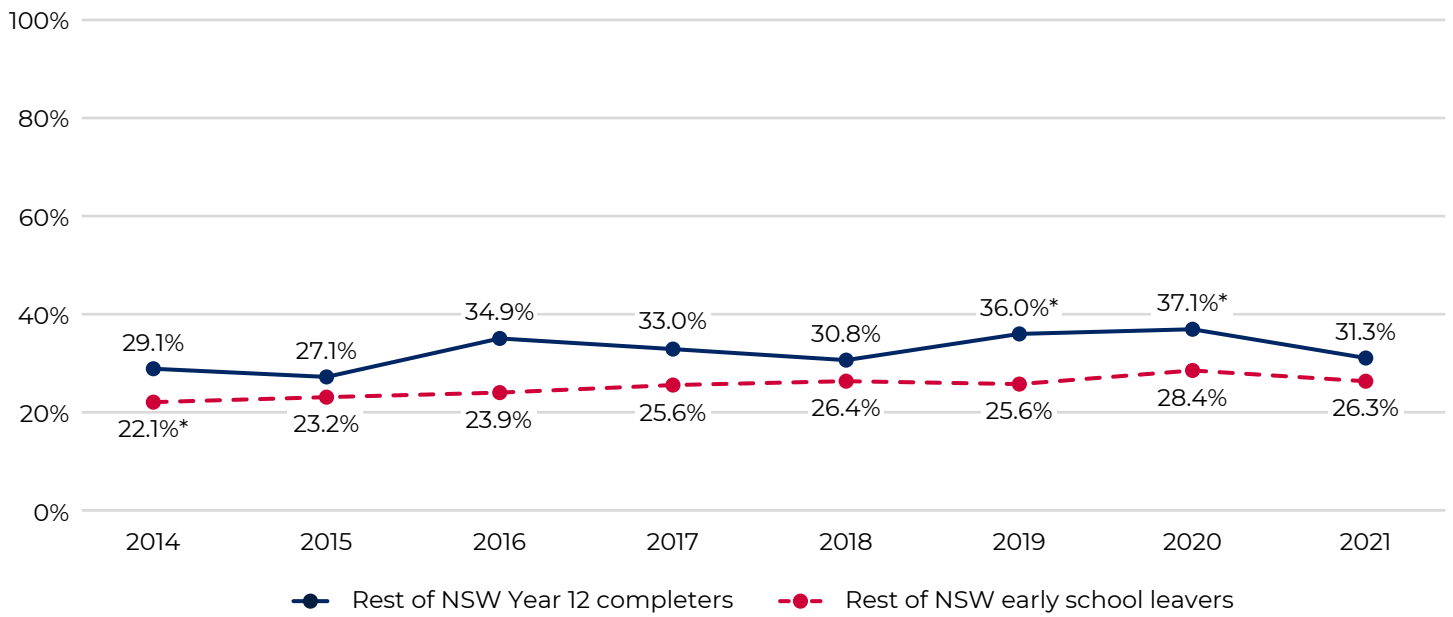

In employment

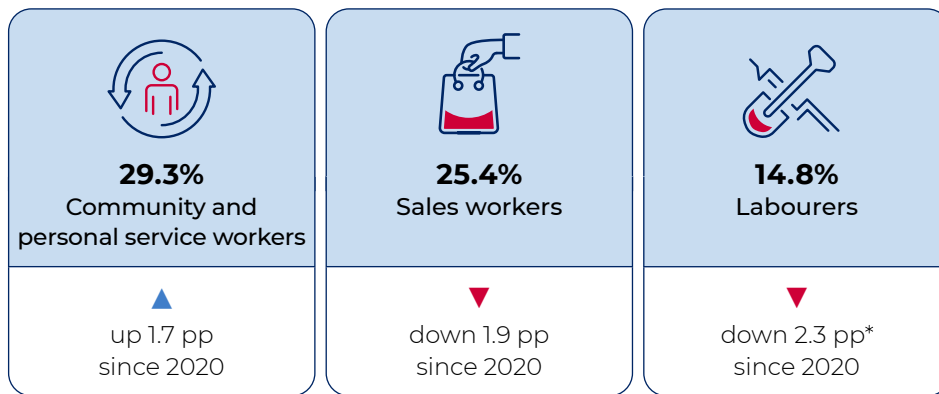

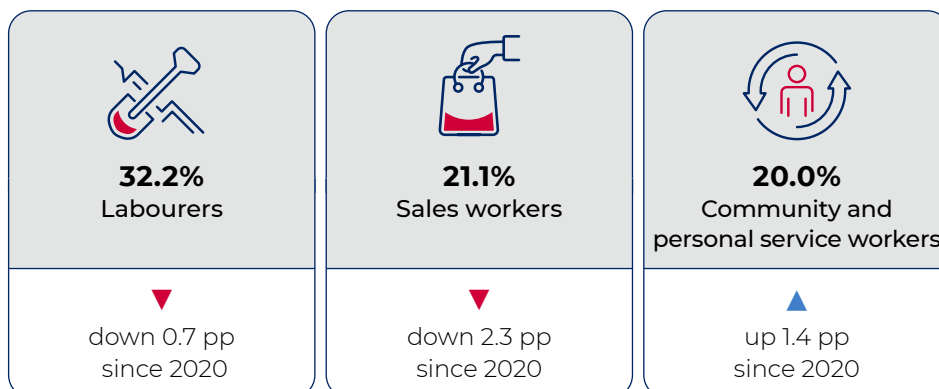

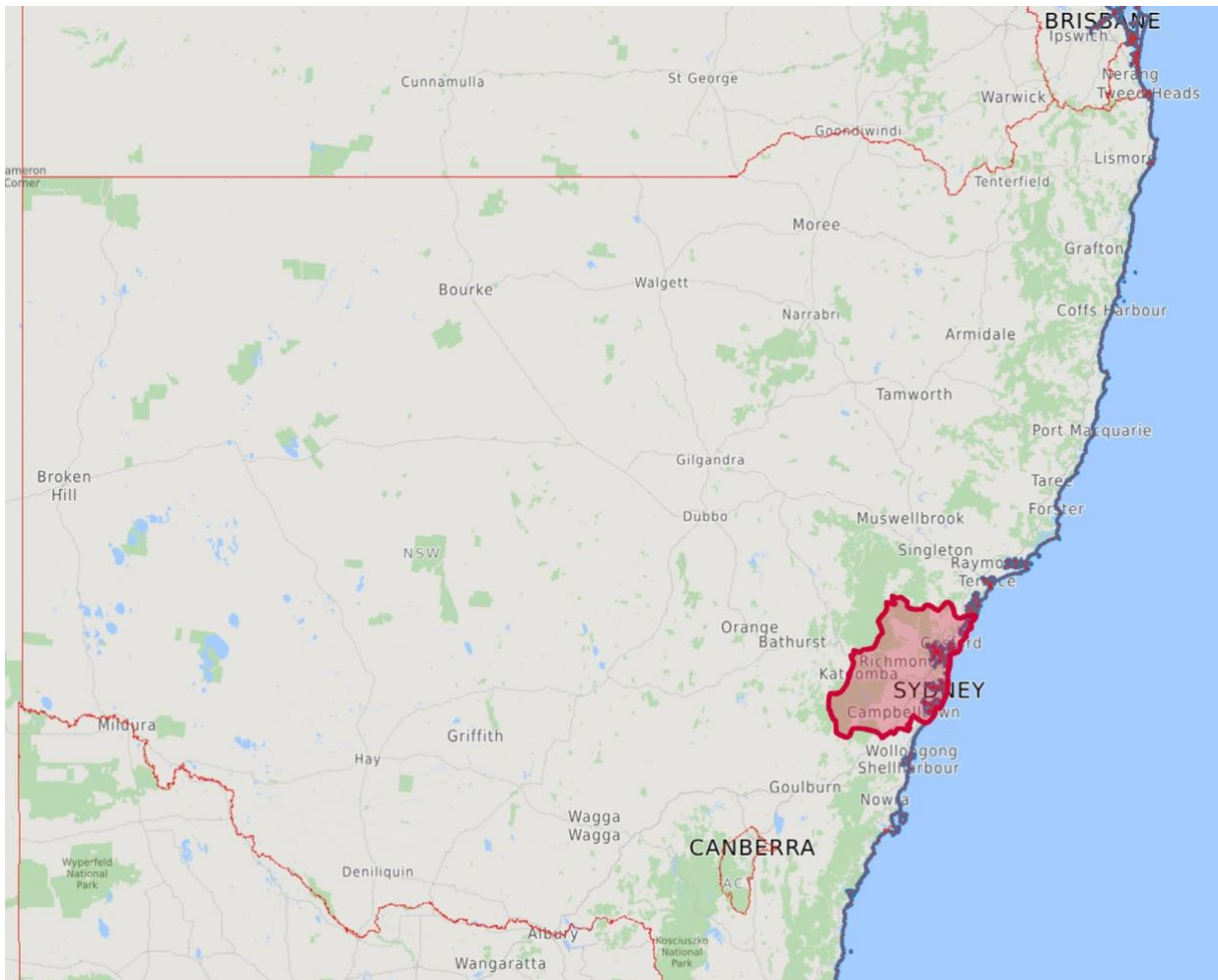

Defining Greater Sydney and the Rest of NSW



 **Greater Sydney region** [Source: ABS Maps Greater Sydney (GCCSA)]

The region variable used in this fact sheet was constructed from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) standard category, 'Statistical Area 4 groupings' (SA4 groupings), and the Greater Capital City Statistical Areas (GCCSA) classification. The department used the 11-group SA4 groupings category for reporting and publishing its own data (NSW Government, 2022)*. To increase interpretability the ABS also assigns these 11 groups to 2 categories: 'Greater Sydney' and the 'Rest of NSW' (that is, outside of Greater Sydney).
