Benefits

How can I use this report?

This report is most useful for a detailed view of individual student results. It depicts each and every attempt of the selected students along with the attempt date/s, result level and result level position.

What should I look for?

This table allows you to sort and find individual students in order to view their attempt date/s and results.

It could be useful for tracking a student who has made multiple attempts within the same domain to ensure their results are improving towards the minimum standard.

It is recommended that this report be used alongside other data sources such as internal school assessment data.

HSC minimum standard

HSC minimum standard criteria

- 1) Students who achieved band 4 or higher in year 9 NAPLAN 2017 in Numeracy, Reading & Writing are exempt from this respective test.
- 2) Students taking an English Life Skills course in Year 12 are exempt from meeting the minimum literacy standard. Students taking a Mathematics Life Skills course in Year 12 are exempt from meeting the minimum numeracy standard. Students who do not take a Stage 6 Mathematics course but who are enrolled in four or more Life Skills subjects are exempt from meeting the minimum numeracy standard.
- 3) Students must achieve a level 3 or above to meet minimum standard for each test.

Overview

The Test Results report allows schools to view the outcomes of each assessment attempt for each domain of the HSC minimum standard for students at their school.

It displays the student name and number, and the assessment domain (Reading, Writing or Numeracy).

Also included are the attempt number (1 being first attempt), the attempt date/s, and the result and the test result level position.

These results are reported according to the achieved level, (1 to 4 from the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF)). The position within that level is included for Reading and Numeracy (not available for Writing) with a Low, Mid or High label. This gives an indication of where a student achieved within that level. For example, a Mid 3 is a better result than a Low 3, which is a better result than a High 2, and so on.

Each assessment attempt is displayed for all selected students. A student with multiple assessment attempts (even if these were for the same domain) will have multiple rows in the table.

Using the report

Select the results you want

The slicers in **Step 1** affect the data represented in the charts throughout the report:

For teachers and executives, your school should be pre-selected, otherwise **select it here**.

Test Attempt: The number attempt for this student, where 1 represents the first attempt made.

Test Result: The resulting level (1 to 4) from the minimum standard.

Test Result Level Position: The position within that level: low, mid or high.

For example, a student result of a High 2 is closer to meeting minimum standard than a Mid or Low 2.

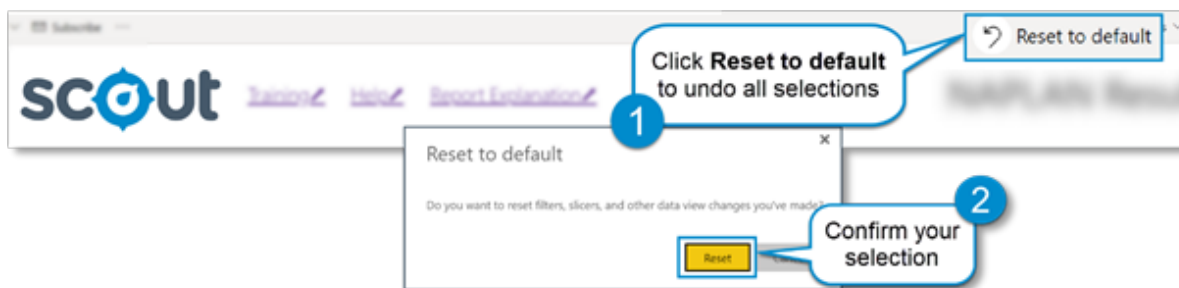
