# **General comment**

Hetty is an enthusiastic student who has settled well into Kindergarten. She has a positive attitude toward her learning and has made good friends.

Hetty has made great progress in science and technology. She shows curiosity and skill when observing living things. To continue improving, she could use more scientific terms when describing her observations during class discussions.

Hetty is also doing well in creative arts, eagerly participating and showing creativity in drawing and printmaking. She has strong skills in creating interesting artworks. In the future, she should learn to express her opinions about artworks by discussing the techniques and materials used by artists.

Progressing well in human society and its environment, Hetty explains clearly why certain places are special and understands the importance of caring for them. Next, she can explore ways to care for shared spaces by looking after her environment.

In personal development, health, and physical education, Hetty has shown consistent progress. She uses equipment safely and knows who are her trusted adults. She can follow the rules during games, but she will need to work on her throwing and catching skills.

English Effort Satisfactory

### **Teacher's comments**

Hetty has made consistent progress in English. When reading, she can identify and join sounds in words. Hetty demonstrates strength in understanding simple texts using her background knowledge to make connections with the stories she reads.

She can retell familiar stories in her own words and identifies the main characters and events in books. Hetty is beginning to take part in class discussions, using simple sentences to explain her ideas. She writes simple texts to describe events and share her opinions.

A next step for Hetty is to improve her reading fluency by adjusting her voice in response to punctuation, and to improve her writing by using capital letters and full stops to make her ideas clearer for the reader.

Mathematics Effort High

### Teacher's comments

Hetty has made consistent progress in mathematics. She actively engages in class discussions and hands-on activities.

Hetty demonstrates strength in accurately counting up to 30 items. She can independently find the total when adding and subtracting two groups of objects. Hetty clearly explains her thinking using drawings and words. She sorts and describes shapes such as triangles, circles, and rectangles. Hetty can name the days of the week and tell the time, on the hour, using a digital clock.

A next step for Hetty is to identify the number before as 'one less' and the number after as 'one more' than a given number; such as, 5 is one less than 6 and 7 is one more than 6. To improve her understanding of telling time to the hour, she needs to practise describing the position of the hour and minute hands on an analog clock.
