#### About this resource

Under Category 2 of the 2025 Health and Development Participation (HDP) Grant program guidelines, Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) services may use funding to engage in professional development and build capacity within the service to support children's health and development.

The list below provides recommendations of courses ECEC services may wish to engage with using the HDP Grant funding. This list is not exhaustive and ECEC services may use funding for other professional learning and development courses, conferences or workshops, provided they are relevant to supporting children's health and development and the Health and Development Checks in ECEC program.
