The central goal of learning a modern language is communication. This includes applying and manipulating your knowledge of vocabulary, grammar and language structures to use and understand culturally appropriate language.

Interacting is done primarily through spoken language.

Interacting

Exchange information, ideas and perspectives in a range of familiar contexts, manipulating culturally appropriate language

- socialise with peers to build and maintain relationships
- make plans with peers
- share detailed information about your own and others' personal worlds
- discuss emotions and preferences
- ask questions, make requests and explain actions
- discuss and justify opinions, ideas and perspectives
- use and adapt a range of communication strategies to interact in different situations

Analyse and respond to information, ideas and perspectives in spoken, written and multimodal texts

- read, listen to and view information, ideas and perspectives in more complex texts, on a range of themes
- use comprehension strategies to interpret and analyse information, ideas and perspectives in texts
- respond critically and creatively to texts, in English or the target language
- demonstrate understanding of the context, purpose and audience in texts
