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Purpose

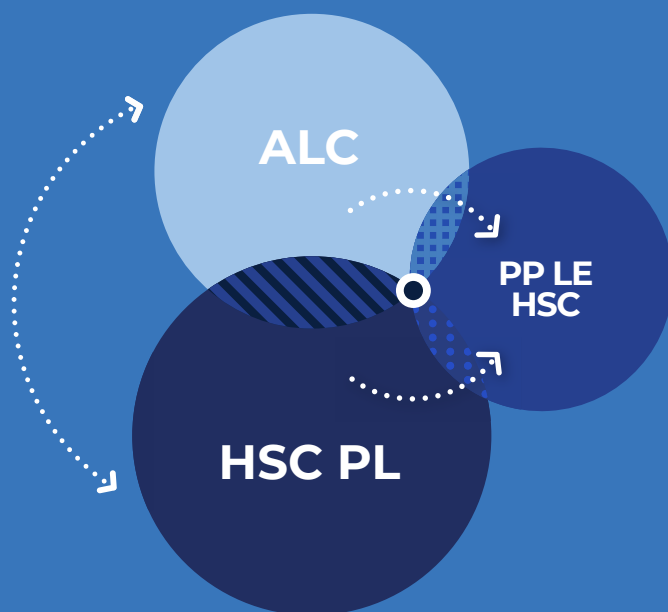
The purpose of the HSC Strategy School Implementation Pack is to:

- Parent Partnerships Learning Ecosystems HSC



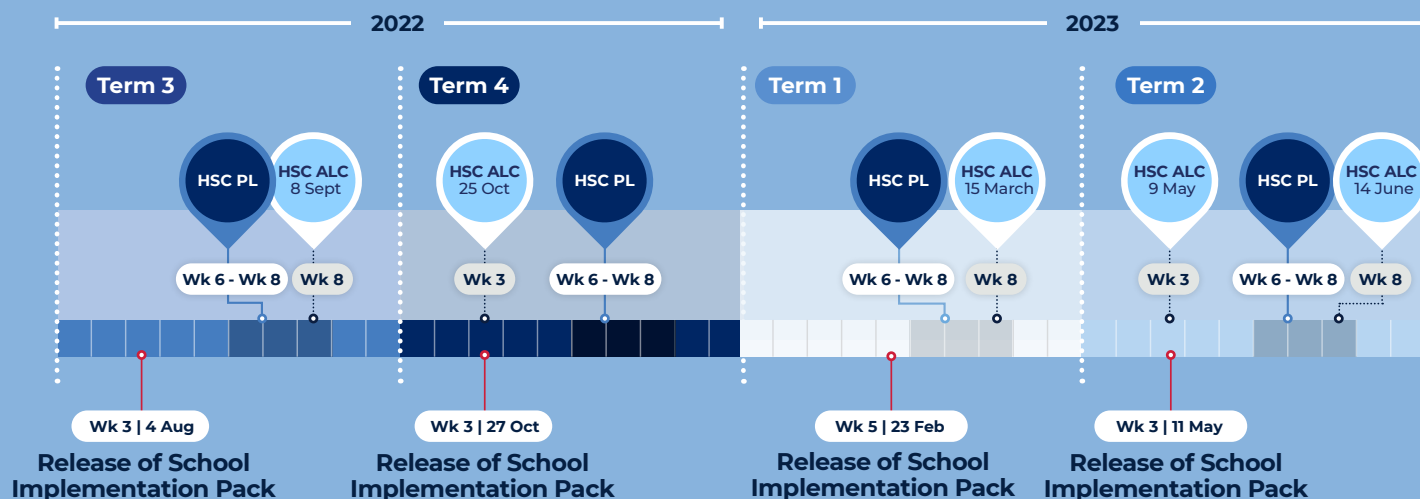
2022/2023 timeline

- To build a high trust and appropriately professionally challenging learning environment for collaboration between Stage 6 teachers in HSC Strategy practices.

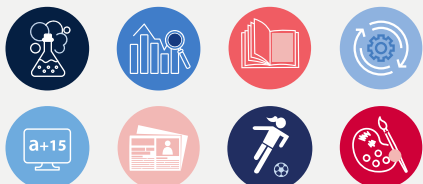

Teachers work through the relevant subject resource individually or in pairs.
45 mins	Group directed Share Analyse Reflect collaboration activity	Participate in a directed Share Analyse Reflect collaboration to begin to interrogate the HSC Strategy focus question, “How will I improve my use of high leverage strategies, so that I can support my student(s) to more consistently provide evidence of the discriminating feature of Band 5 or 6?”.	Groups participate in a directed Share Analyse Reflect collaboration using the <u>directed Share Analyse Reflect collaboration Quick Reference Guide</u> . Group leaders take the role of ‘presenter’.
15 mins	Wrap up	To conclude and decide the next steps in the use of the directed Share Analyse Reflect collaboration for school implementation.	Workshop leaders facilitate wrap up and record next steps.
