# Livestock Farm Worker

Livestock farm workers support the farm manager by raising livestock for meat, breeding, dairy, wool or egg production.

## What livestock farm workers do

Livestock farm workers use their practical, technical and theoretical knowledge of farming and the animals they look after to support the operations of the farm.

They specialise in beef or dairy cattle, sheep, pigs or poultry. They work outdoors in a variety of locations all year round and are prepared for all weather conditions including rain, wind and searing sun.

Livestock farm workers wear many hats as their role varies greatly. They conduct daily tasks to help the farm run smoothly. These include keeping equipment in good shape, cleaning and repairing machinery, tending and feeding livestock, milking cows, and cleaning animal stables or pens.

They also perform maintenance on the land, clearing out brush, cutting fuel wood, keeping drainage ditches open, mending roads, controlling weeds and pests, repairing fences, and performing other odd jobs.

## Will I get a job?

Slight growth in this occupation is predicted, with 800 new jobs in Australia over the next four years, bringing the total to 33,700.

## What will I earn?

Up to \$950 median full-time weekly salary (before tax, excluding super).

You enjoy practical outdoor work in all kinds of weather. You're sensitive and cooperative. You like working alone. You're organised. You have good physical fitness. You're adaptable, responsible and reliable. You focus on the facts and details. You apply common sense to come up with practical solutions to problems.

### A day in the life...

Work as a livestock farm worker may involve these tasks:

- patrol, inspect and report on the condition of livestock
- provide livestock with feed and water
- wash and clean cows' udders, and attach milking machines
- collect eggs and place in incubators
- herd sheep for shearing and keep mobs separate during shearing
- exercise horses by walking, riding, leading and swimming
- clean stables and hatcheries
- perform minor repairs on fixtures, buildings and fences
- assemble, prepare and store horse gear.

- Graduates employed or in further study: 63%\*

#### Certificate II in Agriculture (AHC20116)

- Up to 1 year full-time
- Available as a traineeship
- Graduates employed or in further study: 52%\*

#### Certificate III in Agriculture (AHC30116)

- Up to 2 years full-time
- Available as a traineeship
- Graduates employed or in further study: 77%\*
