## **Key information:**

- Your school's project plan is a live document. Please amend and update the evaluation as you progress through your project.
- Keep evidence-based data from the current status, mid-year and end of year data
  to show progression from start to final outcomes. For example, if your school's aim
  is to increase the number of students who have a transition plan, ensure you know
  how many have a transition plan now, how many by mid-year and how many
  students by the end of the year. Keep a record of your data and/or percentages.
- Take some photos or short videos of students, teachers or school community engaged in your program as this will serve you well when you are promoting your school's achievement through your school's communication channels, symposium and final project evaluation.
- Use all your funds by the end of the calendar year.
- Consider how your school's project will be sustainable over the years.
- If you experience difficult challenges and would like assistance with possible solutions, please contact the initiative team as soon as you identify the issue.
- If there are opportunities where we can visit your school, please send us an invite.

## Rural and Remote - Innovation and impact professional learning MyPL Course



The Rural and Remote – Innovation and impact professional learning series is designed to support schools implement locally designed learning programs that support the implementation of initiatives identified in their Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP). The modules have been created to support teachers across a range of rural and remote school contexts to understand best practice in project design, implementation, and evaluation processes.

There are six core learning modules, each containing topics to support program implementation.

- Module 1 Project idea and alignment
- Module 2 Building a team
- Module 3 Community engagement
- Module 4 Planning activities and ongoing evaluation
- Module 5 Implementation
- Module 6 Project reflection and ongoing sustainability

Modules can be completed individually or consecutively according to participant need. Opportunities are available for participants who complete all module activities to gain assistance from a member of Rural and Distance Education to review a completed implementation plan that represents a culmination of learning across the professional learning series.


### Vocational education and training in regional, rural and remote Australia Report



# Career Story - Dungog High School

"Future You"

Supported by the Rural and Remote K-12 Career Education Initiative, a team of ten dedicated Dungog High School students have developed skills in film production and interview techniques to produce high quality clips featuring Dungog High School alumni. The initiative, coordinated by Dungog High School Careers Adviser Anne Middlebrook and Drama Teacher Louise Rowley, aimed to capacity build a cohort of students to produce a resource, highlighting the career stories of former students, that can be accessed for many years to come.



This provided both the students and staff the opportunity to learn techniques to improve interview, film and editing skills to improve the production of our alumni interviews.

The films are to be stored on a website for participating partner schools to draw upon as a resource to assist embedding career education within their teaching programs. The films can be utilised across curriculum to create connection, awareness and conversations about career pathways and progression within specific subject areas. "The funding assisted us in many ways including the acquisition of equipment, such as lapel microphones and other specific resources that we will be able to use in future years", Mrs Middlebrook said.

To showcase their newly acquired skills, the team members then visited eight of Dungog High Schools partner Primary Schools to teach/mentor over one hundred and seventy enthusiastic primary school students on how to create films featuring alumni of their own individual schools.

Paterson Public School Year 5/6 teacher Mr Matt Lowrey stated: - "My students were thoroughly engaged as the DHS students presented their short videos highlighting career opportunities and insights in our local area to my class".

Mrs Middlebrook praised the work ethic of the Dungog High School students and commented on how the Initiative had helped her team form a sense of community, collaboration, and teamwork.
