

Organic Waste

Schools can manage organic waste on site. Composting systems and worm farms manage fruit and vegetable waste. Mulching recycles green waste. They produce nutrient rich materials for use on gardens.

01 Collection

Organic, biodegradable items can be put into worm farms or compost bins. This reduces the volume of general waste.

02 Composting

Organic waste is gradually broken down into heathy, nutrient rich compost.

03 Reuse

Composted matter can be reused in the school grounds to feed the gardens.

Green waste such as leaves and prunings can be reused straight away as mulch. This helps reduce the amount of water needed for the garden.
