Who is this resource for?

This site is designed to benefit parents and carers of young people who have additional learning needs who may have to be home schooled during the Covid-19 outbreak. It provides a comprehensive array of direct links to educational sites, all of which have full permission granted for any individual, school, college etc. to use on their website.

ALN Home School have gathered and provided almost 100 hyperlinks into one place.

Several of the sites provide specific support on accessibility features of their particular applications (eg. Windows, Apple, Google) and assistive technology solutions to enhance digital interfacing for students with visual, auditory, intellectual and physical disability.
