Special thanks to the two hundred or so teacher-librarians, and especially the many country readers, who took the time and trouble to give us feedback on our first four issues. Replies are still straggling in and being collated. but it was reassuring to find that all but three respondents liked the format. found it easy to read and use and valued the cumulated index.

There was an expressed wish for more and longer special curriculum bibliographies from those teacher-librarians still prudent or fortunate enough to have money to spend. Even the penniless have salted them away for better times. We suspect, from evidence gathered, that signalling specific subject areas on the cover caused some issues to disappear before reaching the library. All government schools and Professional Services Centres were sent all issues in 1982. By stamping the envelopes 'Attention teacherlibrarian' we hope to have overcome this problem.

Scan has been and will continue to be produced on a regular schedule. You can expect issues in March, May, July, September and November in 1983. The editorial date records the month in which the issue is sent to the printer. Except over Christmas, the return date for distribution is two months later. Notes and Miscellany is produced separately and you can hope to see reflected there some of your many suggestions for articles other than those about the assessment and acquisition of educational resources, which is Scan's specific function.

It is perhaps stating the obvious to say that it is the generosity of publishers and the hard work of the curriculum project team members which. with our on-going acquisition and assessment of general curriculum materials. enable special bibliographies to be compiled. The limited first listings, such as the Visual Arts in this issue, will be extended by continuing reviews in Scan and eventually become bibliographies to accompany the new curricula. In the next two issues of Scan, special bibliographies on Writing and Health and Physical Education will be featured, anticipating two of your many suggestions.

Early in 1983, also, we plan to distribute a third Theme Reading bibliography in support of the International Year of Communication, 1983. Marjorie Lobban who was deployed to Library Services from Kadina High School in 1982, has been preparing it before returning to her school. Readers of Scan will appreciate, as we do, the extensive contribution she has made. Sadly, with this issue we are also farewelling and expressing our thanks to two long-time contributors. Peq Taylor and Beverley Fathers from Library Services return to schools next year. Since it seems that neither they nor Marjorie will be replaced, we particularly welcomed the generous offer of help from one reader. Any more of you out there?

Clearly 1983 is going to be a year of limited resources in both money and manpower for all workers in education. Let us nevertheless make it truly a Year of Communication. We shall certainly be trying to communicate to you, as extensively and helpfully as we can, information to assist you to spend your limited budgets most resourcefully for the staff and students in your school. They give representation for such producers as: ABC, BBC, Caedmon; Spoken Arts, KGC, Radio Station 2SER-FM Sydney, Stories for Pleasure, UNESCO and many others. A number of spoken-word cassettes on material included in the 1983 H.S.C. English Syllabus will also be available.

Edwest, a supplier who specialises in Australian produced audiovisual resources for English studies and drama, should also be mentioned. Their catalogue includes material on playwrights such as David Williamson and works of Austen. the Brontes, Orwell and Solzhenitsyn.

HARVEY, Wendely People at work. Macmillan Australia, 1982 (Macmillan Australia Wallcharts)

A dominant male bias renders this set of pictures of questionable value. The text at times recognises a role for women but either omits them pictorially or relegates them to a minor role. Design is unsatisfactory as pictures are placed with no captions or adjacent explanations, and the accompanying text is often too generalised. C.H.

LONGDEN, Peter The planet of the elves. Ladybird, 1982 (Adventures of Major Tom)

With their flat and unexciting plots and garish pictures, these books break the rules of Science Fiction. Scientific trappings and characters are not believable, nor are they true to natural or scientific laws. Other titles are The missing ambassador and The space pirates. P.H.

THIELE, Colin Little Tom Little. Rigby Opal, 1981

Sadly, this story of a boy's search for his missing father, a ranger, exemplifies what not to do. He sets out into unfamiliar wilderness leaving no note, using no directional aids, and one photograph shows him making his way through high grasses with no protection for his feet. There is little to retrieve an ill-founded story. C.H.

TRAVERS, P.L. Mary Poppins in Cherry Tree lane. Collins, 1982

Librarians who are likely to fall upon a new Mary Poppins with glee would do well to read this recent release first. The reader who could cope with the rather difficult language and understand the classical and English allusions would probably demand a more sophisticated story. B.Fi.

★BRIGGS, Raymond When the wind blows. Hamilton, 1982

Gentleman Jim and his wife are victims of a nuclear disaster. The horrifying, almost obscene last days and inevitable death of these two simple, trusting, innocent people make this a picture-book for caring and perceptive young adults concerned with the survival of humanity. Yr 9-12 P.T. .

He concludes that the Bible is a remarkable version of primeval history but one that is restricted by the documents on which it is based and one which is seriously challenged by modern science. 

The many exercises and diagrams will help students compare and contrast non-Aboriginal terms for family relationships and experience of family life. They are books to dip into for an initial taste rather than a resource for detailed research.

Their conclusion that early education is still offered to Aborigines on white people's terms will not surprise anyone familiar with the problems. One of four planned units, this is divided into twelve modules organised in themes: Ourselves, Materials, Changes, Cycles, Energy, Habitats, Structures and Systems. The cards require simple pupil activities that do not need specialist equipment or knowledge. More use could have been made of questions - answers are not given. The cards are a highly appropriate format and the materials excellent, with good humorous illustrations. Though reasonably comprehensive the cards would require supplementing with other materials and activities for the New South Wales Investigating : Science (K-6) curriculum.

The three legends in this series are similarly presented: a booklet with the text of the story in bold type and strikingly illustrated with traditional-style designs, brief notes for teachers and a cassette tape with the story on one side and songs and music from the locale of the legend on the other. The sound reproduction is generally very good, the only obvious flaw being that the narrator occasionally slurs or swallows a word, but this is probably because he speaks with a marked rhythm. It would perhaps have been desirable to have had a little more information about the subjects or meanings of the songs, but that is a minor criticism of an inexpensive and well-presented series. The booklets can be bought on their own, or as described above with notes

BERNDT, Ronald M. Aboriginal Australian art: a visual perspective. Methuen Australia, 1982 ISBN 0-454-00276-9

The collaboration of the eminent Catherine and Ronald Berndt with John Stanton, Curator of the Anthropology Research Museum in the University of Western Australia, has ensured that this is not only an attractive and clear visual presentation but also a scholarly exposition. The scope of the book is the whole of Aboriginal Art, up to and including present-day arts and crafts produced for sale. Emphasis is on the living tradition and the ways in which artists have responded to change, always in the setting of their own culture. Thus there are some striking examples of the way an artist from a traditional background has expressed contemporary, white-influenced society - as in the figure 'A Darwin policeman'.

Early chapters refer to the importance in Aboriginal art of the sacred, and to the fact that some 'secret_sacred' material is forbidden to those for whom it is not intended, and thus cannot be reproduced. The anthropological background is thorough and the explanations are lucid. This, together with the variety, clarity and excellent colour of the illustrations, will make the book a most useful general introduction. For teachers and older students, the detailed notes on each item provide information on artistic style, history and culture, and there are name and subject indexes and a bibliography. K-12 Т. As the introduction to this book points out, the noun 'art' (first used in this sense in 1668) is comparatively recent in English; the Europeans who first evaluated Aboriginal paintings and engravings were completely unfamiliar with the tradition and culture their art came from. Moreover, European culture itself had only recently developed evaluative criteria which owed much to both contemporary and historical influences. The lack of understanding which caused Europeans to label Aboriginal and other art as primitive is therefore explicable. It is only in this century that the growth of knowledge and the lessening of ethnocentrism have led to greater interest and awareness. .

In this beautiful and sympathetic book, the anthropologist and a photographer, Jutta Malnic, have combined to make another significant contribution to understanding. For any school which could afford to buy the two, it is a most useful complement to Aboriginal Australian art: a visual perspective. Not only does the colour plate section provide nearly fifty beautiful and authentically coloured illustrations, but also the text contains personal details and retellings of Dreamtime stories, which give the topic a 'human face' and an added relationship with human emotion.

Both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal readers will be impressed by the tributes from two Aborigines included with the preface, one of whom comes from an area discussed and illustrated in the book.
