CONTENT AND SCOPE: The set is perceived by the publishers, in presentation and content, as a home reading resource for children, pre-school to upper primary, for parent sharing and for child reading and browsing. It is not a junior encyclopaedia. Articles, stories and illustrations have been chosen to stimulate the child's interest in the world - people, animals, environment and how things work - and to capture the child's imagination with a range of leisure activities and selection of traditional and modern literature.

ARRANGEMENT: The fifteen volumes are in three groups. Volumes 1-3 contain a wide selection of children's stories, poems, fables and legends, arranged by reading level. Volume 1 for example, **Once upon a time**, is intended for reading aloud to very young children. Volumes 4-10 are subject oriented with a wide range of information and stories.

Volume 15 is **A guide for parents** describing the growth and development of baby to teenager and practical advice for parenting. This volume includes a comprehensive general index, simple to use, with main entries in bold type, picture references and cross references. Helpful identifiers are provided, for example, after entry 'acoustics (the study of sound),' 'Eiffel Tower (Paris)'.

In addition each volume has its own index, and volumes 1-3 have author and title indexes.

GRAPHICS: Illustrations, whether photographs, paintings, drawings or diagrams are clear, bold and colourful. Wherever possible children feature in the artwork. The format, typeface and colourful covers combine to make an inviting and exciting production.

GENERAL ASSESSMENT: In the school library the set would be a useful reference for teacher and teacher-librarian, and for general browsing by children. Specially commended are the volumes About animals, Holidays and birthdays, Mathemagic and About me. Inevitably many references, examples and illustrations reflect the American background.

CONTENT AND SCOPE: This general junior encyclopaedia on Australia covers history, geography, flora, fauna, towns and cities, famous sports, the arts and Australians past and present. Topical and social issues are covered such as drugs and drug abuse, women in Australia and America's Cup. There is a special focus on nationalities in Australia e.g. 'Italians in Australia', 'Vietnamese in Australia' but readers are sold short on information about Aborigines and some statements are generalised to the point of being patronising.

AUTHORITY: Six authors and two editors are listed on the title page but articles are unsigned.

ARRANGEMENT: Eleven volumes, volumes 1-10 arranged in alphabetical order, letter by letter, volume 11 contains the index. Each volume has 60 pages and begins with an alphabetical list of entries and a brief guide to using the encyclopaedia. Main entry headings are in large, bold capital letters with subheadings in bold lower case. Cross references to separate entries are in small capital letters, the size and faint print of which detract from quick eye detection and follow up. There could be confusion in the presentation format which varies from double columns to right across the page. Index has clear, well laid out entries with heavy type indicating main articles. Cross-references in the index are inadequate which is frustrating for the user in locating information. Volume 11 also includes a section of facts, figures and dates about Australia's history, government and population.

PHYSICAL FORMAT: Individual volumes are strongly bound (stitched and glued) in attractive, hard green covers with different colour photographs on the front of each. The volume number, last entry and alphabetical span are indicated on both the spine and front cover. The index refers to page numbers. Alas, there is no reference on the cover of each volume to the numbers of the pages in that volume.

WRITER STYLE: Generally the writing style is clear and concise and vocabulary simple.

GRAPHICS: Most pages carry small coloured and well labelled illustrations integrated with the text. There is a paucity of maps, e.g. 'Australia' entry has no map, physical or other, and natural resources and primary industries would benefit from maps indicating location and density e.g. coal, sugar.

BIBLIOGRAPHIES: No bibliographies or references are included.

REVISION AND RECENCY: This is a first edition. Information is reasonably up-to-date statistically and factually.

GENERAL ASSESSMENT: This will be a useful acquisition for school libraries which have a need for an encyclopaedia with reliable, up to date Australian content. J.P. A.R.P. \$145 Yr 4-7

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AN INTERVIEW WITH ELIZABETH - LIBBY - HATHORN

Although this is an edited version of a longer interview, as far as possible Libby's words have been retained.

Here at Library Services we have copies of your picture and story books, but you've written or collaborated in very much more. Can you tell us about some of those earlier publications?

They're what I call the school publications. They date back to 1974, when the new English curriculum heralded great change in the classroom. I was teaching in a primary school, using poetry as a basis for a whole language program. There was great interest - from the staff and so forth - and so I collaborated with my husband in the very first book, Go lightly. That was followed by a Language/Social Studies kit called Ozbox : the Australian experience.

It looked at language - and literature particularly - as a sort of springboard for thematic activities. Then, in collaboration with other writers, I did three sets of language-based activity cards. I guess I then moved away from classroom-based materials, until just a year ago, when I was approached by a publisher with what seemed a guite delicious sort of prospect - a comprehensive literature program. **Choices**, as it's called has been a really massive program, K-8, using literature as a source for all kinds of classroom activities.

What sort of feedback have you had so far on Choices?

Well, excellent. I think primarily because it's offered something slightly different in the marriage of reading and writing, in the conference writing and reading approach and in suggesting ways teachers can involve parents in reading and literature.

So language learning publications preceded fiction for you?

Chronologically, they didn't, because I've written stories since I was five years old. But let's say it was easier to publish something that was nonfiction than it was to break, unknown, into the fiction area. And concurrently and throughout my life, I've worked on poetry and that, I suppose, is the least successful area in the sense that I can't show you a publication - a slim volume - of my poems. Unfortunately. That will come, I hope. I am working on a collection now.

One of the things that really intrigued me about your picture books was the dual language publication.

That was a very exciting time, too. I was working with a wonderful editor at Methuen who was very aware and sensitive to the needs of kids with non-English speaking backgrounds. But it wasn't a very successful publishing experiment - I think it came before it's time. What happened was that the books in one language sold but those that were translated were not good sellers. But from a personal point of view, working in the library as I was then, the need for that sort of material was really driven home. There was a twofold thing happening: one, parents could read in the language of their background and enjoy the interaction with their kids, and two, kids could see that there's more than one script, one way to tell a story. It really expanded the vision of a lot of people, having that dual text on one page.

Working with an illustrator. That's always interested me - how you build up that relationship so that what comes out is a true blend of the text and the visual.

I've been lucky in that. With the exception of **Paolo's secret**, I chose my illustrators. Sandra Laroche who did **Lachlan's walk** happened to be a friend of my sister, working in commercial art, when I met her. I had the story ready and approached Methuen with some of her illustrations and they embraced them with great enthusiasm. And then,

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when Tram came up, Sandra found she didn't have the time. I went to an exhibition of Julie Vivas's work and what came after that was a really happy, joint experience. And then I seemed to move away from the concept of collaboration. It was almost as if I needed to step out on my own. I suppose it's this whole ego thing - presenting something up front that's you, unashamedly you. So with Paolo's secret, I didn't want the illustrations to be so prominent. As it turned out Lorraine Hannay's drawings are delicate and sensitive, and secret, was a turning point. I knew that my craft had developed and grown, that I was, in my own eyes at least, a better writer. Every book since then, I've felt the same. I feel I'm more able to focus in a way that lets me refine and make a better job of things and so I've novel will be released in August. It's a very special book to me because it's about an outrageous little girl who leads the way: irrepressible and irresistible, she is based on a real person, the outgoing cousin of my childhood.

And what else are you writing?

Oxford University Press is doing a book called Looking out for Samson which is probably slightly longer than Paolo's secret. It's about a little girl, Bronwyn, whose life is thrown into disarray by her family taking in a friend with a daughter of the same age. It sounds rather serious but actually it's very funny. At present I'm writing the last paragraph of The supercool haircut: the whole story is there but I cannot seem to get the right ending. It's really like the last line of a poem which, to me, is absolutely critical. It ties the whole thing together. The ending will come, in time, but it must be right. My major opus, as I'm calling it, for this year is a novel for adolescents called Thunderwith. I have a film in mind as I write this book: it's a book first but it's visually so strong that I would like to pursue the idea of a film as well. I'm really lucky in that my husband is incredibly enthusiastic about it and, between the two of us, we feel reasonably confident that we might be able to get it off the ground.

In your books, you really home in the child's world.

I supose I like to focus on ordinary events: I want to reflect contemporary living. But I believe there's this whole gamut of emotions, human emotions, contained in the most ordinary of events. I think that for every life there are moments of great joy or tragedy or perfection or laughter or despair and I really want to capture those moments - through the child's eyes. Humble though our lives can be, I think there are challenges in everyone's lives, emotional challenges and moments of greatness...and the way kids deal with these really

When do you find the time to write?

It has to be in the wee small hours as I work full time. There'd be rarely a night when I didn't put pen to paper, when I didn't think about some idea that I'm working on and I would feel it to be a wasted evening if I didn't. That sounds very earnest - I'm not earnest, but writing is just part of my life. A necessary part of my life. And yes, time's a problem. I'm feeling more and more that I need the dignity of uninterrupted time to really come to grips with a fulllength novel where you are able to maintain your energy and the vision of what you want it to be.

Is there anything you would specially like to say?

One thing I haven't said that I think is probably critical to all my writing and that is the influence and effect of poetry on my writing. I feel the discipline of poetry has really helped me in my writing for children: kids are very demanding readers and I think that brevity is important, getting things across in a brief but appealing way with an element of surprise. I want that sort of marriage of rhyme and rhythm as ideas and emotions are expressed. I can't divorce my life from my poetry which is based on intensely private and personal things that I want to communicate: personal as they seem to be they seem to reflect universal themes about the human condition. Writing poems and stories is for me the ordinary made extraordinary through the power and appeal of words.
