<p>A word that comes before a noun and helps to answer the question which one/s in particular. Who has a pronoun?</p>	<p>A word that stands in place of a noun. Who has an adjective?</p>	<p>A word that describes, evaluates or defines a noun. Who has a preposition?</p>
<p>A word that describes the location of a noun indicating time, place, manner, causality. Who has a full stop?</p>	<p>Used at the end of a sentence that is a statement or command. Who has a capital letter?</p>	<p>Used for the first letter of a sentence or for a name. Who has an exclamation mark?</p>
<p>Replaces a full stop to give a sentence a stronger meaning and to emphasise the emotion or feeling. Who has a question mark?</p>	<p>Replaces a full stop to show a sentence is a question. Who has a comma?</p>	<p>Used to separate words, phrases or numbers in a series and the separation between parts of a sentence Who has a connective/conjunction?</p>
<p>A word that joins two sentences together with a logical relationships of time, cause and effect, comparison or addition. Who has speech marks?</p>	<p>Shows part of the text that is quoted or direct speech. Who has an adverb?</p>	<p>A word that describes a verb, an adjective or another adverb Who has a compound sentence?</p>

<p>Two equal status sentences/clauses that are joined by a connective. Who has a proper noun?</p>	<p>Name of a person, place or thing. Always starts with a capital letter. Who has a collective noun?</p>	<p>A word that is used for a group of things. What are opinion adjectives (including judgements)?</p>
<p>Words that tell us opinions such as nice, naughty, nasty, wonderful, marvellous, boring Who has a comparative?</p>	<p>An adjective that compares a noun to other nouns and describes the differences. Who has a superlative?</p>	<p>An adjective that describes the most extreme or highest degree of quality. Who has a finite verb?</p>
<p>Verbs that have a specific tense and a subject with which they grammatically agree. Who has a possessive apostrophe?</p>	<p>Used to show a noun owning something. Who has a contractive apostrophe?</p>	<p>Used to show that a letter is removed to shorten the words. Who has ellipsis?</p>
<p>Three dots together showing missing or unfinished words. Sometimes said 'and. so. on. Who has an abstract noun?</p>	<p>Nouns used to name things that we cannot see but which exist in thoughts and feelings. Who has a complex sentence?</p>	<p>A sentence that has a main (or independent) clause and one or more subordinate (or dependent) clauses. Who has brackets?</p>
<p>Marker (;) used to enclose an explanatory word, phrase or sentence, an aside or a commentary. Who has a semicolon?</p>	<p>Marker used to indicate a separation between clauses that is stronger than a comma but less complete than a full stop. Who has a colon?</p>	<p>Marker used to separate a general statement from one or more statements that provide additional information, explanation or illustration. END</p>
