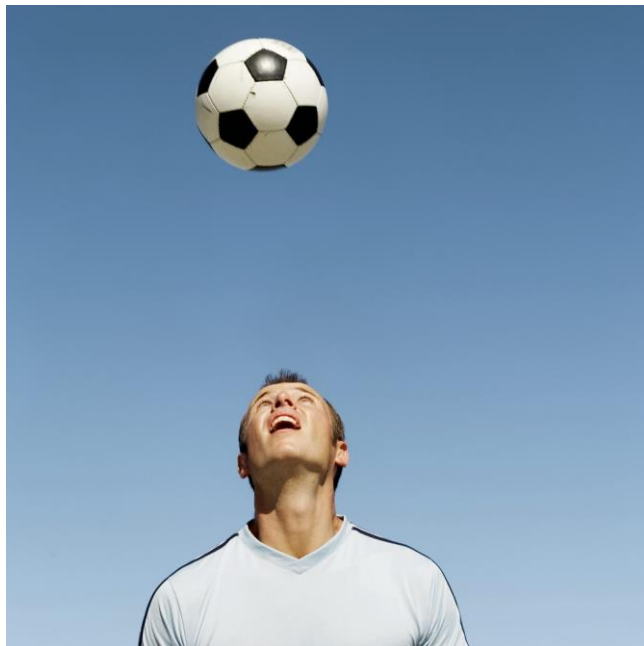

although

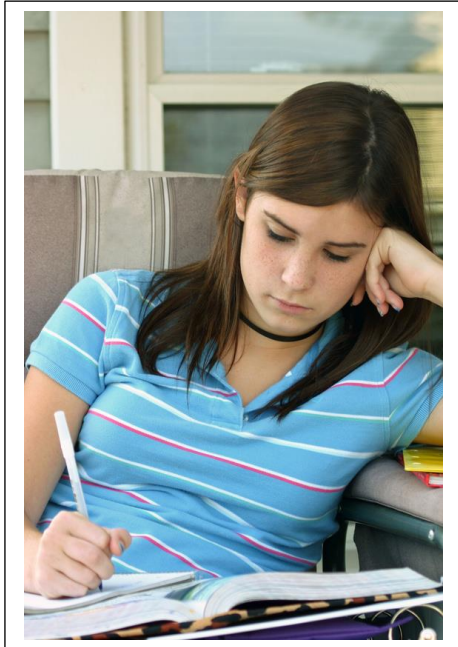
- even though

until

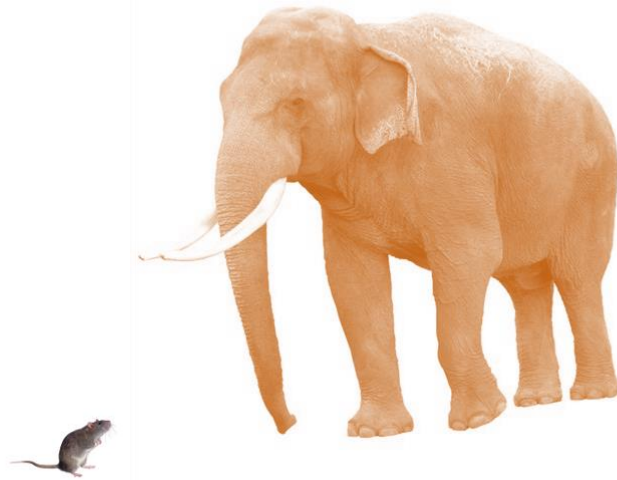
- up till that time
