Children from both an Aboriginal and a low income background will only be eligible for one amount of equity loading per child. Equity funded children enrolled for fewer than 600 hours will attract a percentage of the funding rate calculated according to their hours of enrolment. The loading is applied under the following circumstances: • Only for families with triplets or multiple children above triplets, i.e. quadruplets, septuplets etc. • Only for 4 and 5 year old children. Evidence of applicability will be based on Preschool Census data that shows the siblings: • Have the same date of birth (copy of Birth Certificate to be kept by the preschool service provider enrolling the children), • Live at the same address, and • Are enrolled at the same preschool.
